In Glenayre we also have a strong legacy of community involvement. Keeping this legacy alive and well is important to the Glenayre Executive.



What to Do with Dog Poo

Keeping dog waste off the ground is important. People walk on paths and parks and no one wants to step or slip in your dog's waste. It's not a fertilizer, and does not disappear in the rain.

- Flush it: flushed waste (no bags!) will get treated safely. Do not put dog waste in the storm sewer, which drains untreated into natural creeks.
- Compost it: see City Farmer's website for details on composting dog waste. Don't put this compost on your vegetable patch!
- Garbage: though listed as prohibited from regional garbage, small amounts can be double-bagged and disposed this way.

Remember, dog waste can be hazardous to those who come into contact with it. Please help keep everyone safe by cleaning up after your pet.

By the way, because of toxoplasmosis, cat waste should not be handled, and should only be disposed of in the garbage, not flushed or composted.
